Lawn chairs, bikes, doors & Windows, swing sets, carpet and padding, humidifiers, lawn mowers, toilets, sinks, grills, small TVs, computers, monitors, printers, stoves, microwaves, washers, dishwashers, dryers, water heaters, softeners, refrigerators, freezers (with no Freon or ammonia filled), air conditioners, tires, mattresses, box springs, couches, sofa chairs, sectionals, recliners, fiberglass tubs, console TV's

Items that will not be accepted;

Tractor Tires, Building Materials: wood, shingles or siding from home remodeling, branches, lawn clippings, and regular garbage. No Hazardous Waste

- Funding Applications are being submitted for the Lift Station Replacement Project in 2025.
- The City Engineer and City Staff Met to discuss the repaving of North High Court in the fall of 2024
- The Muni now has pull tab machines and hired another part-time bartender.
- The Land Use Committee presented two building permits, which were approved
- A one-year contract was approved for IT services with Leighton Engineering.
- Gambling Permits were approved for Helping Hands Bingo in July, and the Holdingford FFA Raffle on August 10th.
- Road Closures were approved for Holdingford Daze, July 12th & 13th and for Rockin' Warriors, September 7th
- a Utility Forgiveness Policy was approved.

Please note there is a processing fee for using a Credit/Debit card of 2.75% and a flat fee of \$1.10 for using a bank account.

BECOME AN ELECTION JUDGE IN 2024

Becoming an election judge is a great way to learn about elections and is an opportunity to serve in your community! Consider Working an election this year. You must be eligible to vote in Minnesota and able to read, write, and speak English. Election Judges

are paid \$14 per hour. Judges are assigned to morning, afternoon, or all-day shifts and are required to take paid training. Elections are on August 13th and November 5th.
