



DOGS

The City has continued to receive complaints about dogs running loose.

If you find dogs running loose, take picture if you are able to. During business hours call City Hall, one of the city workers will try to respond. If after business hours, call Stearns County Sheriff, non-emergency lines 320-251-4240. If a dog is caught, the dog will be impounded at the owner's expense.

The City has an animal ordinance, Chapter 91.02, Dogs should be Vaccinated and Licensed, leashed and under the control of the owner when on Public Property, or contained to the owner yard. The full ordinance can be found on the City's Website.

The current Dog Licenses will expire December 31, 2023. Dog Licenses for 2024 to 2025 will be available starting in October.

NUISANCES

The City has several ordinance relating to noise, yards, abandoned vehicles, number of trailers, parking, animals, to name a few. All which can become a nuisance, if not properly maintained.
